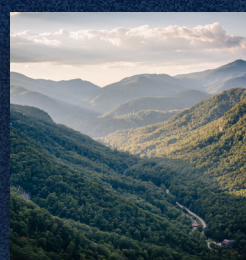
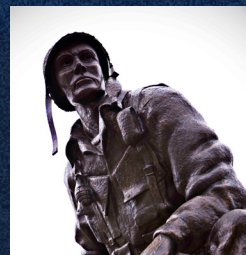

DEEP COMMITMENT TO DEFENSE

North Carolina is committed to supporting its military. The Military Affairs Commission and the North Carolina Department of Military and Veterans Affairs advocate for North Carolina military bases, service members, their families, and the diverse industries that support them. These organizations have direct access to the Governor and state legislators. Additionally, North Carolina does not tax military retirement.

The state supports its growing national security innovation community in many ways, including:

- Availability of free defense-related small business counseling, collaboration, and education opportunities.
- Performance-based incentive programs to help companies that are locating to and doing business in North Carolina.
- A unique matching fund program for North Carolina companies that win federal small business innovation contracts.

Our state is home to seven military installations, an Army Research office, as well as DoD, Army, and Air Force Innovation Offices.
